## Introduction

This is a list of all sources used for compiling the *Corpora of Early English Correspondence* (CEEC-400). The list is arranged in alphabetical order of the constituent parts of CEEC-400, called *collections*. Collections typically consist of letters taken from a single source edition. However, many collections are compiled from two or more sources, and many sources have been used in two or more collections. This means that the number of sources of CEEC-400 is not the same as the number of collections; and also that in the following list, many of the sources are given more than once.

Each collection entry gives the name of the collection, the date span of letters from the source(s) included in CEEC-400 and their combined word count, and the full bibliographical reference(s) of the source(s). Each source reference is followed by the name or names of the subcorpus or subcorpora that the source is used in: *Corpus of Early English Correspondence* (CEEC), *Corpus of Early English Correspondence Extension* (CEECE) or *Corpus of Early English Correspondence Supplement* (CEECSU). In addition, the sources from which letters have been included in the three

published versions of CEEC, the *Corpus of Early English Correspondence Sampler* (CEECS, released 1998), the *Parsed Corpus of Early English Correspondence* (PCEEC, released 2006) and the *Corpus of Early English Correspondence Extension Sampler* (CEECES, released 2021–2022), are so indicated.

The full CEEC-400 consists of 196 collections:

- CEEC, 97 collections (2 superseded)
  - CEECS, 23 collections [of which 2 in part]
  - PCEEC, 84 collections [of which 4 in part]
- CEECE, 78 collections (3 superseded)
  - CEECES 1, 23 collections [of which 1 in part]
  - CEECES 2, 20 collections [of which 1 in part]
  - TCEECES, 42 collections
- CEECSU, 21 collections (1 superseded)

Although most of the CEEC collections are included in full in CEECS and PCEEC, in four cases, due to copyright restrictions, not all of the sources used in a collection are included in the published subcorpora. For instance, only one of the four sources of HENSLowe is included in CEECS and PCEEC. The other affected collections are: CLIFFORD, OXINDEN, and ROYAL 2 [NEW]. The CEECE collections included in CEECES are all published in full, but HURD is compiled from two sources, which are divided between CEECES 1 and 2 for copyright reasons.

Four of the CEEC-400 collections have been superseded by philologically more reliable sources. The editorially wanting collections were treated variously, having been replaced at different times over a period of twenty years. PLUMPTON in CEEC was superseded by PLUMPTON 2 in CEECSU; similarly, THYNNE in CEECSU has been superseded by THYNNE 2, also in CEECSU. In two cases, the name of the collection was retained and only its contents changed: ROYAL 2 in CEEC and SWIFT in CEECE occur twice, with the markers [OLD] and [NEW] indicating the superseded and the current collections, respectively.

Two other collections have been superseded while retaining their names: GIFFARD 2 and PEPYS 3, both in CEECE, were later found to contain letters already included in other CEEC-400 collections. The duplicates were removed on discovery.

In the list of collections, all superseded collections are marked with an asterisk <\*>, and also footnoted.
